

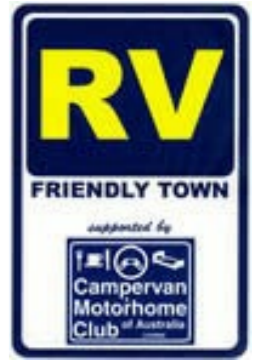
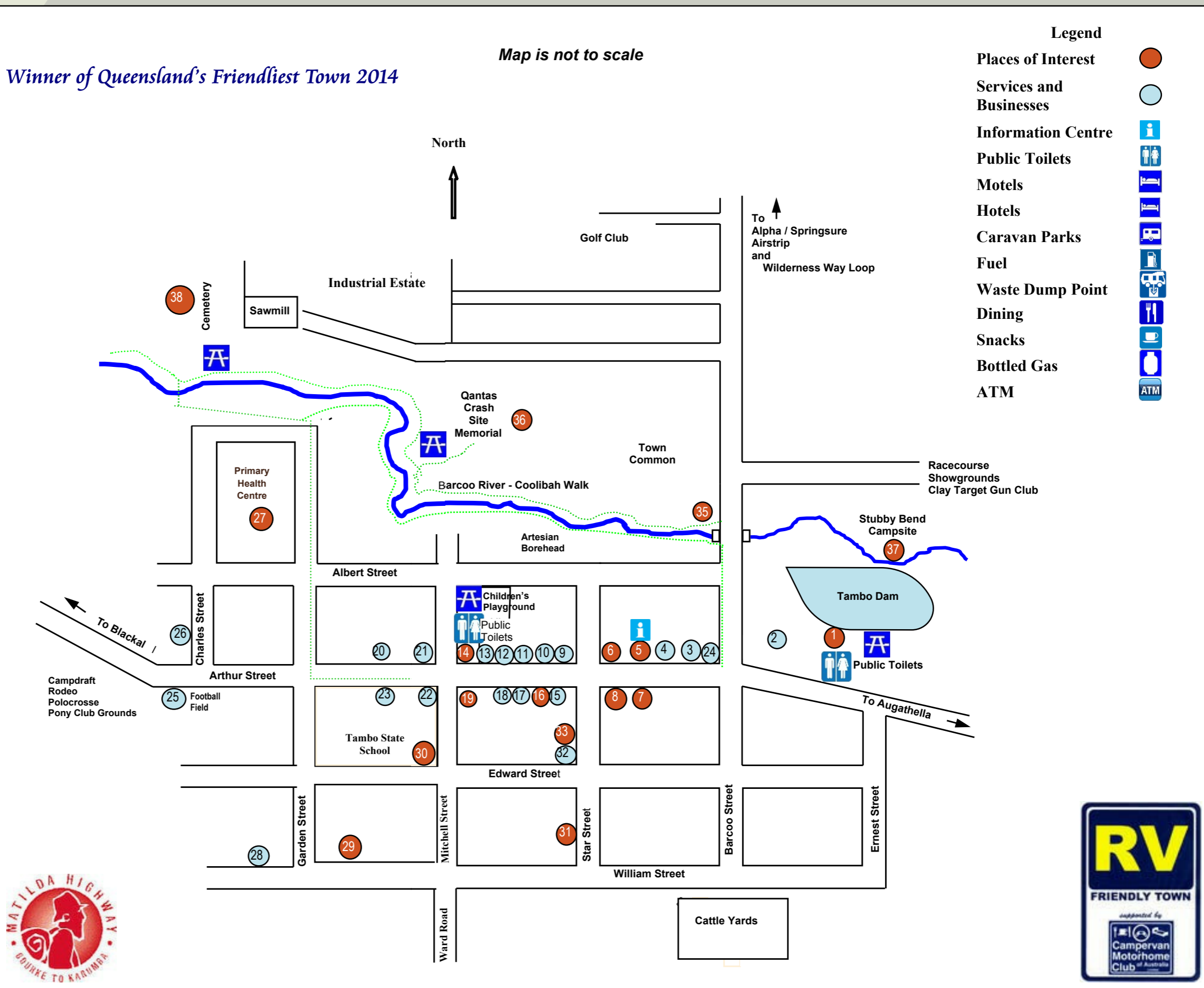

Wilderness Way and Salvator Rosa National Park



Tambo's Wilderness Way is a self-drive of 320 km starting and ending in Tambo you travel through Salvator Rosa section of Carnarvon National Park.

Drive through a picturesque broad valley beneath a striking skyline of sandstone formations. Set up camp at the Nogoia River camping area before taking your four-wheel-drive to explore the sites along the Salvator Rosa scenic drive. Stretch your legs on a variety of short walks or watch for wildlife along the spring-fed waters of the Nogoia River.



Access is by 4WD vehicle. Organise your camping permit online at qld.gov.au/camping before you arrive.

Travel safely

Roads in this area are true bush roads, be prepared for loose gravel and rough gullies. Access roads become impassable after rain. Leave all gates as you find them, slow down when passing other vehicles and be wary of wildlife and livestock on the roads.



Tambo Dam



Tambo Dam built in 1880 to meet the needs of the growing town for a clean reliable water supply. Since artesian water has now take over this role the dam has become a favourite leisure area for both locals and travellers. The well grassed area has picnic tables, free barbecues and adjacent public amenities. For those looking for a little more exercise there is static gym equipment on the walk around the dam.

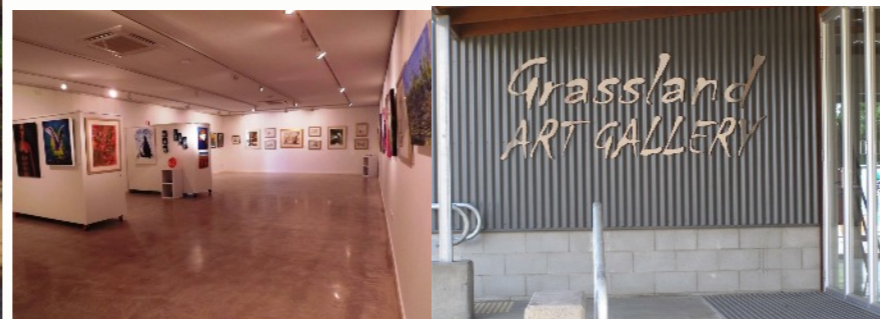
The bird life is prolific in the area and a bird hide has been provided so that they can be studied and photographed. A bird list is available at the Information Centre.



Grassland Art Gallery

The Grassland Art Gallery offers touring, regional and local exhibitions throughout the year. The foyer is reserved for local talented artists to hold exhibitions.

A number of workshops for all ages are also held throughout the year. Free entry.



Visitor Information Centre



The Visitor Information Centre is housed in the Historical Court-house on the eastern entrance to town. There is a large range of brochures for you to peruse. The friendly staff will be happy to answer your queries and let you know what events are happening. Internet computers are available for use for a small fee. The Information Centre shares the premises with the public library, so if you are a reader ask about the "tourist card" which allows you to borrow books from one library and return them at another in the Rural Library network

Post and Telegraph Museum



Located within two Heritage listed buildings you can take a step back in time and check out the history of the town and it's residents. The buildings are manned from April to October by volunteers. You can see the morse code in action. Interact by DVD with residents as they discuss what it was like to live in Tambo. Check out the current displays. Buy some locally made arts and crafts or do a book swap or purchase some titles.
