A highly detailed mural by artists Scott Nagy and Janne Birkner, with a concept based on representing women in regional areas. The Bute Silo Art won Gold for Best Rural Art and Silver for Best Mega Mural at the 2022 annual Australian Street Art Awards. Head to the Railway Terrace car park for the best viewing location.

Bute Stobie Pole Trail

Completed by Bute Primary School students over a 6 year period with the help from local Artist and the Bute Lions Group. The Stobie Pole Trail runs along 8 streets north of the railway line. Each street has its own theme, can you guess what they are!

Bute Mural

Painted by former Port Broughton School teacher John Whitney in 2001. This mural pays tribute to Bute's history, and can be found on the walls of the public toilet building located adjacent to the Bute playground.

Reserve Sculptures

Located at the large Bute Reserve along High Street, the Bute Reserve Sculptures depicts the significance of the farmer and his sheep dog rounding up the sheep. Created by local engineer, Mr Scott Paterson.

RSL Statue

Created by local artist Wayne Dennis in 2014. The soldier feature represents those who have fallen. The best time to view the statue is early morning or night. The morning light makes it shimmer and the backing light at night makes it glow.

Beachfront Takeaway

Painted by Greg Coombs in 1997, the mural depicts the owner of the then Harris' Beachfront Deli 'George' and historic view of the Port Broughton Jetty and was kindly donated by the makers of Farmers Union Iced Coffee and Harris' Beachfront Deli.

Alford

Alford Mural

Located at the newly renovated Tennis Courts, the Alford Mural brings a pop of color and artistic flair to the town, beautifully showcasing local flora and fauna.

Alford Stobie Poles

Created in 2022 by Kadina Memorial School students with the help from art teacher Karen George. The Alford Stobie Poles can be seen along Hight Street.
