

BUSHWALKS





Black Bluff Mountain Walk

Walk from the river valley to Black Bluff passing glacial Paddys Lake - 4 hours return. Alpine gardens and summit views of North West Tasmania - 6 hours return.

Winterbrook Falls

Walk through ancient rainforest and 2000-year-old King Billy Pines to a 200 metre high waterfall. Check track access before you attempt this walk. 5 hours return walk.

Preston Falls Raymond Road, Preston Delightful 25 metre waterfall that plunges into the shady depths of a gorge and is surrounded by blackwood forests. A 10 minute return walk.


Dial Range Bushwalks



Penguin Attractions

1. Penguin Golf Course

2. Perry Ling Gardens

 Seaside gardens bordering the eastern entrance of Penguin.

3. Penguin Market

5. Three Sisters - Goat Island Nature Reserve

Small offshore islands. Cross at low tide to a nature reserve, to see Goat Island's marine life and birds. Take a rod and throw a line into the 'fish trap', discover shallow caves, and look for clues to the history of the reserve.

Nearby, a cluster of small islands known as the Three Sisters are bird sanctuaries.

6. Ferndene Nature Reserve and Dial Range Walks


- Ironcliffe Road, Penguin. Short walk through rainforest to Thoresby's Tunnel.





WALKS

Explore the Leven Canyon, Leven Canyon Road, Nietta, through all seasons with well maintained all-weather walking tracks. Experience the roar of the river in winter and spring or enjoy the shady walk on a warm summers day. Hours of exploring await you all year round!

Cruickshanks Lookout

Cruickshanks Lookout offers fantastic panoramic views of the Leven River winding it's way through a massive limestone gulch 275m below. Standing on the platform you feel inspired by the dramatic cliff formation with a sheer ridge opposite the lookout. Undulating forest covered hills in one direction and Black Bluff on the other. A 20 minute return walk.

The Forest Stairs

Take the challenge of the 697 stairs down to the Edge Lookout. Watch and listen for birds like pretty Pink Robins. 11 of Tasmania's endemic birds are found in the reserve. Completed in 2008 by the Central Coast Council the steps make the area accessible and are a fantastic feature. 1 hour return walk.

The Edge Lookout

From the Edge Lookout feel the power of the Leven River. A birds eye view of the waterfalls below the lookout and witness the Leven River's dramatic zig zag through the canyon. The Edge Lookout was built in 2011 by the Central Coast Council and is a great way to experience the heart of the canyon. 1 hour return walk.

Canyon Floor Walk

Drive a further kilometre down Loongana Road to the Leven Canyon Floor Walk. The down hill track leads to the boulder strewn Canyon floor. The River Bridge is a great place to witness where the river has carved its way between the massive rocks. With 45,000 kilolitres daily (up to 70,000 kilolitres in winter) raging through the canyon it continues to be a battle of water vs rock. 1 hour return walk.

The Devils Elbow

Continue past the River Bridge taking the track to the right, walk through a mixture of ferns with patches of Spagnam Moss. Look down to the Canyon Splits and up to see the silhouette of the Devils Head. Then on to the Devils Elbow where the river takes a sharp 45 degree turn giving a spectacular view of the geographical formations. In the winter and spring especially, the roar of the river truly shows the power of nature.

A 90 minute return walk.
