

# Meningie Walking & Cycling Trails

## Scenic Loop

**Grade:** Easy, suitable for beginners, low level of fitness required.

**Road type:** Sealed

Breathtaking views of Lake Albert will be a highlight along the Warrengie Drive scenic loop. The best time of day to capture that 'winning' shot is early morning or right on sunset, imagine moody foggy waters and beautiful evening skies. Here you will also find an abundance of bird life.

## Lions Self Guided Walking Trails

**Grade:** Easy++, suitable for beginners, low level of fitness required for sealed section.

**Road type:** Sealed (rubble)/unsealed

The walking trail main entrance is located off Bowman Street (opposite East Tce).

As you explore the trail be sure to keep an eye out for over 20 species of beautiful and fascinating flowers, peak flowering time is between August and November. If you're keen to try your hand at geocaching, this is the perfect opportunity to start your adventure.

## Pelican Path

**Grade:** Easy, suitable for beginners, low level of fitness required.

**Road type:** Sealed

A relaxed 400m interpretive walk situated along the waterfront of Lake Albert highlights the European, Aboriginal and environmental history of Meningie. Take advantage of the many seating and viewing platforms along the way and immerse yourself in the unique Coorong atmosphere.

## Monument Trail

**Grade:** Easy, suitable for beginners, low level of fitness required.

**Road type:** Sealed

The history buff within you will enjoy revelling in the rich historical sites of Meningie. Discover the periods from the Australian servicemen and women who served in all wars and conflicts and the bush ranger who robbed his victims astride an ostrich!? Fascinating stories.

## Murray Coorong Trail

**Grade:** Easy++, suitable for beginners, medium level of fitness required.

**Road type:** Sealed (rubble)

This 450 kilometre nature-based recreational trail is being developed along the edge of South Australia's iconic Murray River, Lakes and Coorong waterways, and is set to provide a unique experience and destination for visitors from across the world.

## Free Bike Hire Information:

- » Bikes can only be used during daylight hours and during operational hours of the hire location.
- » It is required by South Australian law to ride with a helmet, these are available free of charge at the hire location.
- » Bike riders must obey the same rules as motor vehicle drivers. Please familiarise yourself with the rules specific to bike riders at [www.sa.gov.au/cycling](http://www.sa.gov.au/cycling).

### Safe Riding Tips:

- » Keep to the left and ride at least one metre clear of the kerb and parked cars.
- » Be seen, wear bright coloured clothing.
- » Look for other vehicles at intersections – never assume a driver has seen you.
- » Ride in a straight line and signal your intention to turn.
- » Cyclists of all ages are allowed to ride on footpaths
- » When riding on footpaths ensure you warn pedestrians of your approach by sounding the bell.
- » Take the supplied bike lock with you so you can explore on foot or relax in a cafe.

### What Happened If You Get A Mechanical Failure?

- » If you get a puncture or mechanical failure, it is your responsibility to return the bike to the point of hire.

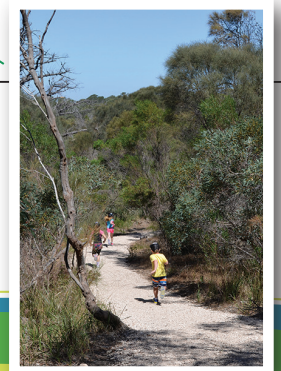
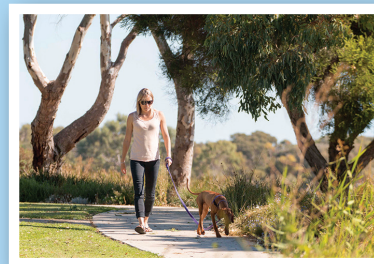
