Farm is a working farm, so we ask you to follow a few rules to ensure the safety of all visitors, staff & animals:

Please:

- Supervise your children closely at all times.
- Take care when feeding or patting animals. They can't tell the difference between fingers & food so please keep your fingers & body parts away from their mouths!
- Thoroughly wash your hands after visiting animal areas & before putting your hands to your face.
- Only feed animals with food we provide.
- Do not chase or scare animals.
- Do not drop rubbish as animals may eat it.
- Shut & latch gates you pass through.
- Beware of uneven ground & sharp wire on fences & gates.
- Touch displays in the cottage or outside with extreme care as most items are original & irreplaceable.
- Thank you for not smoking.

History

The original cottage & outbuildings were built before the 1890s from paddock stones. The veranda and kitchen were added in the 1920s using locally hand quarried limestone. Most of the animals and displays at Echo Farm, including the agricultural machinery & furniture may have featured in the life of a local farming family from the 1890s to the 1950s. Our animals may change due to the natural circle of life but we try & keep the same species as listed.



Chainsaw Carvings

Carved with a chainsaw from old cypress trees in situ by Kevin Gilders, the figures display an Australian timeline:
'First Here' Boandik man with boomerang. 10,000-year-old boomerangs were found 45kms away at Wylie Swamp.
'The Explorer' South Australia proclaimed a province 1836.
'Settler's Children' Mount Gambier founded 1854.
'Light Horseman' from World War I; 1914-1918.
'Making Do' & 'The Swagman' Depression era 1930s.
'Goodbye Mate' WW2 Soldier from 1939 - 1945.
