



The Port Broughton Area School Remembrance Walking Trail

Located just inside the entrance to the Port Broughton Area School is the Remembrance Walking Trail, a 1 km long trail through natural scrubland. This trail was researched and built by a core group of students and staff.

All major wars that Australia participated in, from the Boer War through to Afghanistan are each commemorated with a large stone wall and an information board explaining the

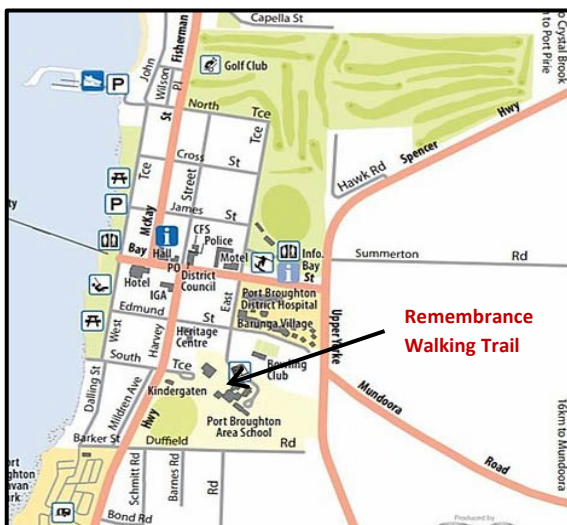


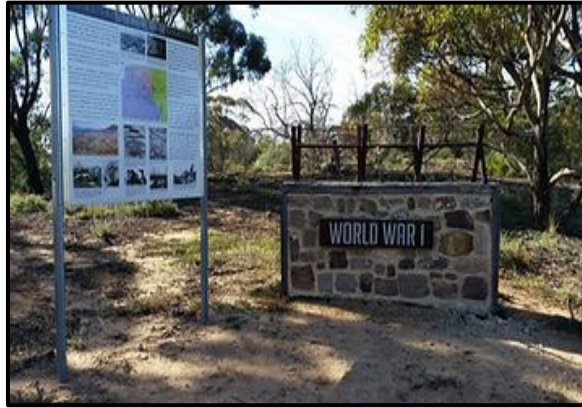

103 small metal signs have been placed along the trail. Each sign has a short summary detailing a significant world event from each year between 1899 and 2001. The events were researched by students, with the most significant ones being recorded on the metal signs, and they include such events as the JFK assassination, the Beatles breakup, the Mao uprising in China and the discovery of Machu Picchu
