



BONDI TO MANLY WALK



The Bondi to Manly Walk links all the existing coastal and harbour-side walking tracks between Australia's two most famous surf beaches, Bondi Beach and Manly Beach.

For its entire length the Bondi to Manly Walk is on public land, with the vast majority of its 80kms on existing well-made and well-maintained bush walking tracks.

MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS

BONDI BEACH

Australia's most famous surf beach and home to the world's first lifesaving club. More than a million travellers visit Bondi every year for the quintessential Aussie sun, surf and sand.

SYDNEY OPERA HOUSE

One of the world's most famous buildings and Australia's number 1 tourist destination. The Sydney Opera House was opened in 1973 on a site sacred to the Gadigal people and now hosts over 2000 shows, 363 days of the year.

SYDNEY HARBOUR BRIDGE

Since opening in 1932 the Harbour Bridge has shaped the City of Sydney. Its steel arch span and two pairs of granite pylons have become a symbol of Sydney and Australia.

MANLY BEACH

Manly, so named by Capt. Arthur Phillip in 1788 because of the manly nature of its indigenous people, is famous for its ocean beach and the ferry service from Circular Quay which started in 1852.

HIGHLIGHTS

Camp Cove & South Head

Camp Cove is a popular harbour beach where Capt. Arthur Phillips first landed in Port Jackson in 1788. South Head offers magnificent harbour views, old harbour fortifications and lighthouse keeper's cottages and the colourful Hornby Lighthouse.

Historic Houses on the Southern Harbour Shore

Vaucluse House is a nineteenth century mansion with its substantial original gardens still intact. Elizabeth Bay House, built in the 1830's, was considered the finest house in the Colony of NSW.

Mrs Macquarie's Chair

Mrs Macquarie's Chair is a bench carved into sandstone by convicts in 1810. According to legend Mrs Macquarie, the Governor's wife, would sit there waiting for ships to arrive from England.

May Gibbs Nutcote

Nutcote was the home of children's book illustrator and author, May Gibbs. Now a museum, it celebrates the life and work of the creator of the gumnut babies - Snugglepot and Cuddlepie.

Curlew Camp on Little Sirius Cove

For nearly twenty years Curlew Camp was a place where artists lived and worked on the Harbour shore, and it is where two of Australia's most famous artists, Arthur Streeton and Tom Roberts, painted some of their best known works.

Significant Sites of Aboriginal Heritage

The track goes through an Aboriginal midden between Fisher Bay and Sandy Bay. At Grotto Point there is a large number of Aboriginal engravings. Reef Beach is the home of an ancestral reburial site and rock art.

SHORT WALKS

South Head Heritage Trail

1km loop | 30 min - 1hr

Incredible beaches, harbour views, historic military remnants and fantastic whale watching opportunities.

Green Point Walking Track

2.5km circuit | 1 hour

Starting on the Ocean side of South Head where biannually the whales pass close to the cliffs, perfect for watching from The Bluff, you'll then pass the scenic and historic Camp Cove and Green Point on Sydney Harbour with spectacular views looking back at the city.

Hermitage Foreshore Track

1.8km | 1 way | 30min - 1 hour

One of Sydney's great coastal walks, this track provides walkers with stunning views of Sydney's harbour, islands and icons.

Cremorne Point Circuit Walk

3km loop | 1 hr 30mins

Follow the picturesque foreshore of Cremorne Point on this quiet ferry accessible loop. Be sure to pack a picnic - the views from this loop are superb.

Bradleys Head Walk

4km | One way | 1hr 30 mins - 2 hrs 30 mins

Feel a million miles away from the city on this gentle bush track looking back at Sydney's most famous icons - Sydney Opera House and Harbour Bridge.

Manly Scenic Walkway

10km one way | 3hr 30mins - 4hrs 30mins


One of Sydney's best walking tracks with beach, bush and beautiful views all bundled into one extraordinary walk.

North Head Sanctuary

10km loop | 3 hr 30 min - 4 hr 30min

Another spectacular walk around North Head Sanctuary that starts and finishes in the easily accessible Manly centre. This Walk weaves around the beaches of Sydney Harbour, gives spectacular views back across South Head, the city and middle head before following the cliff line along the coast back in to Manly, passed the iconic and secluded Shelley beach.
